She made almost all of our school clothes and we were proud to say that there wasn't another outfit like ours in the whole world.

She taught us the value of honesty, truth and integrity without even using the words. She taught us about the unconditional love of Jesus and family. She prayed with us and for us. She was an obedient servant to the Lord.

She was very involved in the work of the Lord. She played the Piano at Bluff Ridge Baptist Church for over 20 years for every service, even Wednesday nights! She loved music and used her God given talents as there were intended. She was WMU Leader, taught SS, Bible School, played short stop position on the church softball team. Even though mom played the piano and only sat with us for half of each service we were the best behaved kids in the congregation. One “mom look” over that piano and we knew to stop whatever we were doing and pay attention to the service.

Mom made sure that everyone felt welcome in our home. There would sometimes be 20-25 neighborhood kids in our yard because having fun was more important than our lawn. She always had some type of cake, cookies or fudge made from scratch readily available just in case someone dropped by. She always seemed to enjoy handing out Kool-Aid through the screen door no matter how many dirty little hands knocked.

One night, in the wee hours of the morning during her almost 100 days in the hospital we talked about everything she had gone through since her stroke on June 19, 2016 and in our tears agreed that God has His plans and that He will be glorified in the end. Now that's a woman of faith!

I take comfort in knowing that her pain and suffering is now over and that she is running, dancing and singing in the presence of our mighty Lord and Savior. She will be greatly missed but this life is temporary. If we are to see her again we must recognize that we are

sinners, turn from those sins and put our faith in Jesus Christ. She told me that if one person came to Jesus through her pain it would all be worth it.

Mom impacted so many lives while here on earth that if each one of them said just one word about her the talking wouldn't stop until Jesus came back. It was an honor and a privilege to have been her daughter and if I am ever half the wife, mother, daughter and friend that she was I will be happy with that.

Do I miss her? Absolutely! But I would not bring her back from Heaven's splendor for one second if I could. I am reminded of the lyrics to a Ray Boltz song, "Thank You". Look it up if you have time, it describes moms life so well.

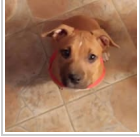
