I was so tired, my body ached so much that I was questioning why I was even on this hike with you guys. Hikers know that you tie your food up off the ground to keep animals from getting it. You guys proceeded to toss, again and again a rope over a small tree near us to tie up our food. With each missed toss, we all chuckled. Finally, Terry had the idea to climb the split of the tree and toss the rope from there. He needed you to brace him, and up he went. The rope was looped over the limb, and Terry went to step down. Except his foot was stuck about 4 ft from the ground. You began to pull him, I began to laugh. You played tug of war with the tree, using Terry. I laughed so hard that I began to cry, you started laughing, Terry was yelling, and finally you managed to pull Terry loose. After we all stopped laughing, I could see that unmistakable pride of accomplishment. I had forgotten my aching body, and now we had a food rope dangling about 5 feet off the ground. I still remember Terry hanging the food, and in my memory that limb drooped until the food was about 2 feet above the ground. I can't remember much after that because I was laughing too hard. I think one of you asked should we hang it higher, to which the response was "let the animals have it." John I sure do miss you buddy, and look forward to catching up with you one day in heaven. 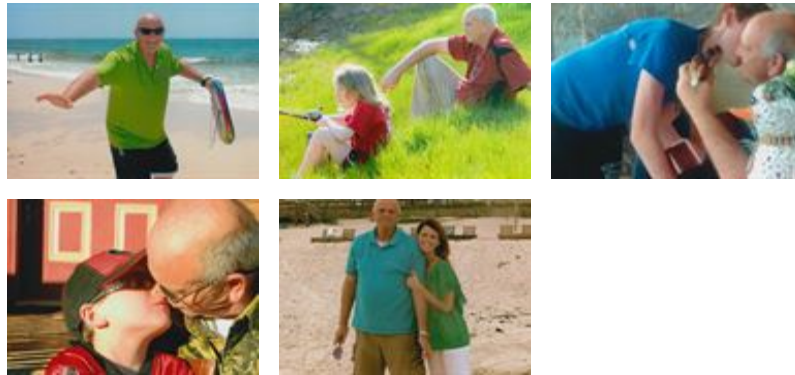
