Unknown to most, I had slipped away to the quiet living room by the fire and was openly grieving the loss of my parents. Your mom must have discerned my absence. She came into the quiet room and immediately said, as though she knew my mind, "you miss them, don't you?" The counselor had the pastor cornered. Your mother sat patiently and listened as my broken heart

told the story. And then, Kathy prayed with me and left the fire-lit room as quietly as she had entered. Those moments were never spoken of again until now, but I will never forget your mother's empathy, kindness, discernment, and sisterly love.

Time marches on for all of us. But allow me the privilege to pay this story forward with each of you when those moments of deep sorrow get the best of you. To that end, I shall continually pray for you and your families.
