Milton Eugene Fullman, Jr, 73, of Vestavia Hills, Alabama passed away on September 13, 2023. He was a 1967 Berry High School graduate who attended Samford University. At Samford, he met the love of his life who became his wife of 53 years, Lynn Grisard.

He served in the U.S. Navy from 1969 – 1974, where he was a hospital corpsman and operating room technician. During his service he lived in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and lived aboard several ships. He was a millwright at US Steel for 30 years. After retirement, he became an award-winning photographer and President of the Society of American Travel Writers (2005). As a photographer he traveled the world with his wife, and his work was published in numerous magazines and newspapers. He was a longtime member of Vestavia Hills Baptist Church, where he was a member of Joyful Noise Sunday School class.

His charismatic personality was infectious to all who met him. He was a beloved husband, father, and grandfather. He loved the beach, jet skiing, and being with his grandchildren and was actively involved in all of their lives. He never found a problem he couldn't fix for his family, which earned him the family title of "Superman." He always taught the importance of good character, integrity, hard work, and the value of getting a good education.

He is preceded in death by his parents Milton E. Fullman, Sr. and Dean Majors Fullman.

He is survived by his beloved wife, Lynn Grisard Fullman and his daughters
